



March Cruise to Fernandina Beach on Amelia Island, Florida

Amelia Island has two marinas offering overnight dockage to cruisers. At marker "3" proceed up Jackson Creek to friendly Amelia Island Marina, which has a convenient on-site restaurant and Cantina Louie nearby. However, four nautical miles farther north on the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) is an outstanding boating destination - Fernandina Harbor Marina - adjacent to a charming town with shops, historic buildings, bars, pubs, restaurants, galleries, hotel, B&Bs, a Saturday Farmer's Market, a fort, beautiful marsh views, and more.

Five boats were originally signed up for the trip to Fernandina Beach. But boat repairs and family priorities whittled the number down to one boat - 'Dream Catcher'. When a bleak weather forecast threatened this boat trip, I was feeling pretty low. Bill and I checked NOAA National Weather Service Marine Forecasts to see if there was a good weather window we could take advantage of. We departed one day early and enjoyed a wonderful cruise on Wednesday, March 17 from Palm Coast to Palm Cove Marina in Jacksonville Beach. The front was to approach North Florida Thursday afternoon, so we departed at daybreak and arrived at Fernandina Harbor Marina by noon before the ICW waters became choppy. We hadn't planned that our slip would be on the inside of the long face dock with so little wind protection. We rock'n'rolled quite a bit throughout our stay. However, the wind didn't stop us from enjoying walks in town, scouting out the best places to dine, and a most pleasant visit with Barry and Barbara Kipnis who stayed Friday night at the Hampton Inn.

Bill and I were surprised that the wind would not let up. So we extended our stay at Fernandina Harbor an additional night, departing Tuesday, March 23 under close to ideal boating weather. With the wind at our stern and favorable tidal currents we cruised the 60 miles to St. Augustine Municipal Marina with ease. Then enjoyed a late lunch at Athena's Greek Restaurant and some shopping along George Street. Departing St. Augustine Wednesday morning March 24, arriving in Palm Coast unscathed - fortunately!

Bill and I were not going to take 'Dream Catcher' on the water in bad conditions, and guided by marine forecasts our boat performed admirably, not unlike "The Little Engine That Could".


