

PCYC Cruise to The Marina at Ortega Landing May 27 - June 3

On Thursday, May 27, two boats from the PCYC fleet departed on a week-long trip to one of the premier marinas in Florida - The Marina at Ortega Landing in Jacksonville. The Marina at Ortega Landing is located in the Riverside neighborhood of Jacksonville, along the shores of the St. Johns River and Ortega River. To cruise to this Marina our fleet takes the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) to Mayport, and then proceeds up the St. Johns River to the Ortega River. It's a two-day trip with a stop at Palm Cove Marina in Jacksonville beach on our first night.






