

# **Fleet Captains Annual Report**

The year 2021 started with plans for a large boat cruise for the fall of 2021. Eventually we settled on a January 2022 cruise.

We initiated a plan to visit New Smyrna Beach during February but it was cancelled due to increasing COVID infections and rescheduled for March. In order to meet existing COVID preventative measures, no public events or socials were scheduled so small fantail social gatherings dominated the weekend.

On April 17<sup>th</sup> the club held its annual Blessing for the Fleet at the Yacht Harbor Village Marina. The weather was deteriorating up until 5 minutes before the Blessing and the skies opened and Father Goolsby was able to bless 5 boats. The Blessing was followed up with a picnic style event inside the Yacht Harbor Village facility. In May the club had a progressive dinner, where boaters visit multiple waterfront homes and share various food items, appetizers and entrees and eventually gathering at the Yacht Harbor Village facility for deserts and cocktails.

On a short notice trip at the end of May, a couple of boats attended the MTOA rendezvous at Ortega Landing in Jacksonville, FL.

July 4<sup>th</sup> trip to St Augustine for their annual Independence Day Fireworks Display. Again the weather was mostly overcast with spotty rain showers, but it cleared up for a beautiful evening of fireworks. Towards the end of September the club participated in a Poker Run where boaters went to multiple waterfront homes to collect playing cards and ended at the Yacht Harbor Village facility to play poker. The winning hands were provided with various gifts.

In October the club did a Photo-scavenger hunt for water related objects and met at Herschel Kings Park for a catered BBQ meal at the pavilion.

On another short notice event, several boaters went to Marineland for a weekend in late October.

In coordination with the Flagler County Sheriff Department who operates several marine vessels, the Club initiated an educational program for water safety. The program gets kicked off with some boat safety inspections scheduled during our November and December boating trips.

November 5<sup>th</sup> we planned a 3 night trip to Halifax Harbor (Daytona) coupled with a 2 night trip to New Smyrna Beach. Unfortunately gale force winds up to 34 mph and significant waves along our planned route prevented the trip.

December we went to Palm Cove and then on to Fernandina Beach, returning via an overnight in St Augustine. We were in port at St. Augustine to watch their annual parade of lights (boat parade) and view the reported 6 million lights along their water front businesses.

Although 2021 was hampered with several bouts of unfriendly boating weather, we were able to squeeze in a couple of extra events with some last minute planning. All in all, we still persevered with many fun and exciting boating activities.

In Memoriam


