MAY TAKEAWAYS FROM THE EMT'S

On Tuesday April 18th Otis presented the 2nd of his educational series with three EMTs from the Palm Coast Fire Dept. I got my CPR and 1st Aid training some years ago and since then CPR has changed twice and 1st Aid once. Some of the things we learned were:

For adults, CPR is back to 75 compressions per minute and two rescue breaths per every 30 compressions. To keep germs away, the EMTs recommended a plastic one-way breathing shield.

If you need a tourniquet to stop the bleeding of an open wound, it must **not** be removed until you arrive at a hospital. Therefore, a tourniquets' use should be the very last resort.

Keep away from poisonous snakes and bugs. If bitten, call 911 for an ambulance; do not drive to the hospital yourself. The 911 ambulance is probably faster and will be able to order the anti-venom while on the move. ALL anti-venom comes from the Miami area and must be flown here.

Strokes require an anticoagulant within 3 to 4.5 hrs. The only location with an anticoagulant is your local hospital, not the ambulance, not the local emergency care, and not a local doctor.


eight-man crew team. All agreed that, although it wasn't a book they would have picked up on their own, it was definitely enjoyable and worth their time.
