Chili Cookoff




The 2nd Annual Chili Cookoff was held March 8th at the home of Barbara and Barry Kipnis. Seven

Safety Aboard - For Captains and Guests

Most of you know that Ginny fell and broke her arm while getting off the boat after the Poker Run. It seems like a good idea to review safety rules.

Captain's Responsibility:

- Let your guests know your rules before you get underway.
- Don't overload your boat. Always have a life jacket for each person aboard.
- Decide whether your guests should be <u>wearing</u> life jackets. Obviously, it's always a good idea, but sometimes it's essential. Size of boat, wind and water conditions, and mobility of guests should determine how strict you should be. It's YOUR BOAT and YOUR DECISION.
- BUT ALL children under 13 MUST wear life jackets. (Florida law says "under 6," but the 7 to 12s probably don't know that, so lie a little. We are used to Illinois law, which uses 12 as the cutoff.)
- Point out location of throwable cushions and life jackets.
- Decide whether you allow drinking while underway. (Barry and I do not!) Under no circumstances should the captain imbibe. The risks and penalties are just too great. Wait until you're tied up!
- Make sure your guests can safely get on and off the boat. The boat should be steady, not
 rocking. A handle on a piling is always helpful. Otherwise, make sure an able-bodied person
 is on the dock to give a helping hand.

Guest's Responsibility

- ALWAYS have one hand on the boat and one hand for yourself, unless seated. Boats have handholds and railings for a reason.
- Check with the Captain on where to put your carry-on bags, food, etc. Captain will know the best spot for everything.

- Stay seated when docking, unless the captain assigns a job to you. Captain will tell you when
 it's safe to move around. (Believe me, you don't want your body between the crew and
 whatever they need to do fast.)
- Take turns moving around. "Look, there's a dolphin!" can result in everyone crowding to one side and a potential capsize.
